

From the once beautiful and vibrant center of community activity it was in Cather's time, by mid-century it had become a lifeless eyesore. But with vision and help from our wonderful donors, we were able to transform it back into a teeming beehive of Cather and community goings-on.

The restored Opera House is also helping us to *pioneer our future* by providing us a base from which to host events and live performances. It also allows us to work on such critical programs as properly archiving our amazing collection of Cather artifacts and memorabilia, as well as push forward on programs to help ensure that school kids throughout Nebraska and the region are reading Cather and then coming to her hometown to fall in love with her work as we all have.

Our new campaign will also help us to build the foundation for the upcoming restoration of the Moon Block, the building adjacent to the Opera House that will house a proper home for our Archives, expand our bookstore, create residential units for operational income, give us backstage space for the Auditorium and renovate five business bays in historic downtown Red Cloud.

2009 was a year that helped the Cather Foundation move forward in so many ways, and with your help, 2010 will take us much, much further. I sincerely thank you for all that all of you do.

Efforts to preserve our past are part of daily operations at the Foundation office in Red Cloud where the staff works diligently to preserve and maintain ten historic sites that are directly related to Cather's life and work.

The Red Cloud Opera House, once Cather's cultural window to the world, is again at the center of Red Cloud life. 2009 brought another incredible year of programming with highlights including a special traveling exhibit from the Smithsonian Institution, "Beyond Baseball: The Life of Roberto Clemente" (as well as number of presentations we describe on page 4).

Restoration of the Willa Cather Memorial Prairie continued to move forward with removal of nearly 2,000 invasive trees, reintroduction of native plants, and the practice of rotational grazing. Most notable was a 200-acre prescribed burn that will enhance restoration efforts through the promotion of native plants and the creation of a diverse habitat for animal species.

Additional activities included a second Elderhostel (now known as Road Scholar); a week-long Prairie Writers' Workshop; co-sponsorship of the 12th biennial International Cather Seminar; and the 54th annual Willa Cather Spring Conference that included a special centenary birthday celebration in honor of our founder, Mildred Bennett.

Your past support has enabled the Foundation to become a multifaceted organization that serves many diverse interests. Whether your passion lies with preservation of our historical collection; programming in our beautifully restored Opera House; or restoration of our native prairie, we thank you for your generous support of our efforts to preserve the legacy of one of America's most beloved authors and we hope that you'll be our partner as we pioneer our future.

CATHER AND CHICAGO

The Cather International Seminar found itself, in 2009, in a city that was vital in the development of Cather's imagination: Chicago.

Chicago was the major rail hub for Cather on her journeys East (and then back West). It was also a vital center for music and opera and the home of the Art Institute, where Cather encountered the inspirational world of European art. Cather's novels often touch on the city: The Song of the Lark and Lucy Gayheart, in particular, draw on Cather's deep experience of Chicago.



The University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the Cather Foundation jointly sponsored the International Seminar, based at the "University Center," a purpose-built convention facility in downtown Chicago. Events included a reception in the "Cliff Dwellers" club, a spectacular space overlooking Millennium Park and Lake Michigan, and a reading by Cather enthusiast and fellow-novelist Bradford Morrow in the Chicago Public Library.

Mr. Morrow, who has family roots in Nebraska, deftly interwove reminiscence, literary criticism and place-writing in a narrative that had the resonance of memoir.


And then there were the papers. We had over 120 attendees, and some 80 papers over four days. We had a lively gathering of familiar faces and new acolytes, professional scholars and independent readers and critics: all, we hope, to be seen at the 2011 International Seminar in Massachusetts.

A RICH AND DELICIOUS LEGACY

We are grateful that Ann Romines' duties as Professor of English at The George Washington University did not prevent her from dedicating a good deal of time and effort during 2009 to the creation of At Willa Cather's Tables: The Cather Foundation Cookbook.

Romines, a Board of Governors member and accomplished amateur cook, has honored Willa Cather and the Foundation itself with a lively book that celebrates not just Cather's love of good cooking, but also the artistry with which it is reflected in her work. A treasury of rare photographs, reminiscences, personal essays, and abundant recipes old and new, the book invites you to enjoy the foods served at Willa Cather's many tables, in her fiction and in her life.

With a large helping of recipes from the Cather Foundation and its many friends worldwide, the book is also that wonderful thing, a *community* cookbook. This particular community is one that spans the globe, and many decades.



A WORLDWIDE MISSION


As much we love to share with visitors the "miles of copper-red grass ... drenched in sunlight" that Willa Cather described so expressively in My Ántonia, we embrace the fact that Cather belongs to the world. She was a native of Virginia, spent formative years in Nebraska, and traveled extensively throughout her lifetime. As beloved as her prairie novels are, it is a disservice to her legacy to think of her as merely a prairie novelist. Her gaze was wider.

The Foundation takes pride in the Nebraska-based historic preservation work that constitutes a part of our mission, but we realize that it is perhaps not practical to bring Cather's reading public all to Red Cloud for a visit — at least not all at once.

For that, and for a great deal more, we have the web. At www.WillaCather.org, we can do our part in bringing this timeless writer (and citizen of the world) to the attention of a virtually limitless audience. The Foundation's website is increasingly central to our activities, both in communicating news of local programming and in hosting stories and features of interest to a global public.

In 2009 we were honored to publish "Rediscovering Serena's Album," featuring the entirety of the 1880s memory book owned by Cather's schoolmate Serena White. Among many entries in this fascinating document, available nowhere else, is one by a precocious teenager named "Wm. Cather M.D." We also have begun posting videos of noted writers including Pulitzer Prize winner David McCullough and the late Cather scholar Susan Rosowski; created for the award-winning documentary Willa Cather — The Road Is All, these interviews are available thanks to the efforts of the film's director, Foundation Board of Governors member Joel Geyer.



IN THE OPERA HOUSE

There were several standouts among the broad assortment of cultural programs and activities in the Opera House and Art Gallery in the last year. Quilters, a community theatre production, was a musical tribute to the lives of pioneer women as interpreted through the panels

of a legacy quilt. Red Cloud quilters themselves created the piecework backdrop for the production, and there was also another important tie-in: in cooperation with the Quilts of Valor Foundation, the Art Gallery displayed more than forty beautiful quilts created over a three-year period and later donated to area war veterans.





Our old friends and annual visitors, the Missoula Children's Theatre, helped young area performers put on *The Little Mermaid*, and twins Gunnar and Matthew Nelson brought classic rock-and-roll to the venerable Opera House with their tribute to their father, "Ricky Nelson Remembered."

The New York-based Paper Plane Theatre Company staged Sarah Ruhl's *Eurydice* during a 2009 summer residency in Red Cloud — a highly memorable experience for area audiences, and we hope for this ambitious young company as well.


"WILLA CATHER'S GREENWICH VILLAGE"

Although she traveled widely, for most of her adult life Willa Cather was a New Yorker. And for more than 25 years, her home was Greenwich Village. One of the Foundation's activities far from our Nebraska headquarters is our guided walking tour of Cather's Greenwich Village, which culminates at the Bank Street site of her longest Village residence — the "walled stronghold of her very self," in the words of her friend Elizabeth Shepley Sergeant. Under the direction of our founder Mildred Bennett, in 1975 the Foundation erected a plaque commemorating Cather's residence there.

Some of the sites on the tour exist in memory only, or are represented mainly by plaques. But many Cather-related sites in this historic neighborhood remain, creating an evocative fabric against which we can recreate the life and times and work of "the noted American author."
