

MARK YOUR CALENDAR FOR THE 59TH ANNUAL WILLA CATHER SPRING CONFERENCE

The 59th annual Spring Conference and Symposium, June 5-7, 2014, will focus on the complex impact of the natural environment on Cather and her contemporaries, and on the writers and artists of the generations that have followed. Drawing upon recent scholarly analyses focused on Cather's "ecological imagination," this conference seeks to broaden and extend these ideas, both within Cather studies and beyond.

From her earliest fiction, Cather was closely attuned to the world around her, and her beautifully limned landscapes are integral to her characters, defining them and their situations. In *O Pioneers!* and *My Ántonia*, Cather was the first American novelist to treat the Plains of Nebraska as setting; as such, she taught her readers how to read that landscape, how to integrate with it.

Beyond grasslands, Cather mapped many other literary landscapes: the Southwest in three novels, colonial Quebec in *Shadows on the Rock*, the New York streetscape in "Coming, Aphrodite!" —Throughout, we experience the reverse of what Cather says of Clement Sebastian in *Lucy Gayheart*: he "had missed the deepest of all companionships, a relation with the earth itself, with a countryside and a people." Her characters possess—and are possessed by—landscapes, formidable and formative environments, that shape and color Cather's work. While acknowledging connections to Cather and to her far-seeing art, we encourage analyses drawing from similar concerns and sharing a similar ecological imagination while focusing elsewhere.

A unique and popular feature of the Willa Cather Spring Conference is that all are welcome to participate. The Willa Cather Foundation encourages anyone who might be interested in Cather's life or works to attend, including recreational readers, history enthusiasts, students, teachers, and professional scholars.


CATHER BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

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BRAZILIAN EDUCATORS EXPERIENCE RED CLOUD

In July, 40 high school English teachers from Brazil took a break from their professional development course at the University of Nebraska at Omaha to spend a weekend in Red Cloud. Sponsored by UNO's International Professional Development department and its "Nebraska Neighbors" program, the visit gave them the chance to taste life in a small Midwestern community, improve their skills in English, and also learn more about the life and work of Willa Cather. The Foundation welcomed them to Red Cloud with a community dinner, followed by town and country tours, a visit to the Cather Prairie, and local attractions—yes, including the bowling alley! Bringing these kinds of cultural experiences and an understanding of Cather's work to a growing international community is an important facet of our work and our mission.

If you've looked at the cover of our 2014 calendar, "A Year with Willa Cather," then you've noticed two of our favorite pieces from our archives here in Red Cloud: Willa Cather's own steamer trunk and her passport. Both items were donated to the WCF Archive by Jim and Angela Southwick—the trunk in 2004, and the passport in 2006. The trunk is stenciled with "Miss Cather" and "New York" and bears a number of shipping stickers, attesting to Willa's love of travel. The WCF boasts an impressive collection of Willa Cather and Cather family objects and documents related to her life and works, and we're proud to have them here in Red Cloud! The Willa Cather Book Club has begun meeting again! Beginning with *O Pioneers!* (2013's One Book One Nebraska selection), the group plans to read a variety of Cather material, including Willa Cather's letters, selections of her nonfiction, and historical fiction — a murder mystery by author Sue Hallgarth, based on Cather's time in Grand Manan. This year, we're also hosting a virtual book club on Facebook, so

even if you're not in Red Cloud, you can join in the fun!

We're also pleased to provide book club discussion questions and discussion leaders' enrichment materials as part of our educational mission, developed for the celebration of *O Pioneers!* 100th publication anniversary and with One Book One Nebraska readers in mind.

2014 OPERA HOUSE SEASON

To meet the WCF's arts-based mission, the Foundation provides regular programming in our restored 1885 Red Cloud Opera House and Art Gallery, which played a huge role in developing Willa Cather's own interest in the arts. In 2014, the Opera House will be entering its 12th season of events, and we are thrilled to be hosting many wonderful programs, including music, exhibits, and theatre.

Patrons of the Opera House will have the opportunity to attend several live shows, including a production of Cather's *My Ántonia* by Illusion Theatre; *Completely Hollywood* by the Beatrice Community Players; and a show starring local youth directed by the Missoula Children's Theatre.

Concerts will include local musicians Lester Junction and Lukas Rupprecht; a musical journey through the pop scene of the 1960s and 1970s; a cabaret show by Mary Carrick; the hot cover band Taxi Driver; the Wes Hird Trio featuring jazz vocalist Vickie Nielsen; tribute shows featuring the music of Patsy



Cline and Johnny Cash; and Joseph Hall's Elvis Rock 'N Remember Tribute.

The exhibit *Grand Ole Opry Classics*, a program from ExhibitsUSA, a national division of Mid-America Arts Alliance with the Nebraska Arts Council and Nebraska Cultural Endowment, will be shown April 6 through May 25, 2014.
